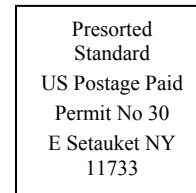

## A Sound Idea?

### **Four football fields long...eleven stories high...a floating industrial platform anchored in the Sound...**

The Broadwater liquefied natural gas terminal proposed for Long Island Sound is at an important crossroad. With Federal approval a certainty, only New York State can stop this facility that has alarmed environmentalists, activists, and community organizations throughout Long Island.

Recently, our Association wrote the following to Governor Spitzer:

*As residents of Long Island's North Shore, we have a deep commitment to protect and preserve Long Island Sound. Our commitment is shared by our elected officials- Congressman Tim Bishop, Assemblyman Steven Englebright, Suffolk County Executive Steve Levy and Town of Brookhaven Supervisor Brian Foley.*

*The ongoing 21 year joint EPA, New York and Connecticut partnership is responsible for the remarkable continuing restoration of the Sound, our vital and valuable natural resource. A mid-Sound industrial zone was never a consideration nor should it be, in the Sound's Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plan.*

*The proposal located in New York waters, just over the dividing line, would negatively impact both Connecticut and New York. Additionally, Long Island would bear the foreseeable problems associated with the onshore support facilities proposed for either Port Jefferson or Greenport. Connecticut Governor M. Jodi Rell has conveyed her state's opposition to Broadwater to you.*

*We ask that you join Governor Rell in order that collectively, we all can continue to fulfill our responsibility to protect and preserve our Public Trust Lands, the waters and submerged lands of the Sound, in its entirety for the use and enjoyment of this and future generations.*
